At Bellevue School we are committed to providing an education that is relevant to children’s needs and helps prepare them for the future. As part of this your child is involved in e-learning and using ICT devices as a tool for learning. This means students are using a range of technologies to support and enhance their learning.

Each child from Year 3 to Year 6 has their own account to use Google Drive under our school domain through Google Apps for Education. Being under the Bellevue School domain means that all of your child’s work can only be seen by their teachers and other students in the school if they share their work. Also, students can only send and receive email from people who have a Bellevue School email address.

Having a Google Drive enables students to access work at home and for parents, teachers and other students to comment or leave feedback. Some of the students’ work, which could include photos, videos, art or written work will be saved and available online through our school website or classroom and individual blogs. As part of student programmes they learn about online safety. The students’ surnames are never published alongside their work or images.

We require parent approval prior to placing images and work on the internet. Please read the following, sign it, then return it to the school office.

If you have any concerns please feel free to discuss them with your child’s teacher, the Deputy Principal for your child’s area of the school, or the Principal.
